Frequently Asked Questions

How do I get started?

- Go to the GPG [Toolkit](#) page and read “[a Note to Filmmakers](#)”
- Ask a studio sustainability representative
- Add a sustainable lens to everything you do.
- Discuss fuel consumption with your Electrical Dept, Locations Manager, Generator Operators and Transport Dept. = Challenge them to save fuel.

How do I find out if my studio has a sustainable production program?

- If you're working for a [SPA member company](#), email info@greenproductionguide.com and ask to be in touch with the studio sustainability representative.
- Ask your production executive for the contact of the studio sustainability representative.

How do I find Sustainability Support?

- Ask for your studio sustainability program representative
- Look for your production sustainability champion - someone who's interested in championing the sustainability message!

Where do I get more information about generator Tiers?

- See the EPA [non-road engine](#) emission standards
- Tier 1 = dirtiest. Production should use at least Tier 3; and right size equipment.

How do I afford the cost of clean tech?

- Look at the operational costs of running the equipment.
- Add in the estimated fuel consumption costs of business as usual to reduce the cost of the clean tech.
 - Calculate the premium of renting a fuel efficient car, and subtract the fuel savings.

Where can I find clean tech?

- Look at the [vendor list](#) on the greenproductionguide.com. It includes international and national filming cities.
- Ask your local vendors for what you want.

Where can I find Renewable Diesel?

- Check out the [RD one-pager](#) on the greenproductionguide.com
- RD is readily available on the West Coast of the USA. In California, it's at the pump - go to the 76 retail stations. It's on the Warner Bros. lot, too!

How do I approach a Location Tie-in?

- Ask the Locations site rep if there is grid power available
- Ask your Locations and Electrical Dept to put together a proposal for how they want to tie in.
